As I prepare to embark on my fifth GPLEX, my second as Executive Director of the Economy League, I pause to reflect on why we have run this program for 14 years. For me, it is about building what we call "civic muscle," the sinews and connective tissue of a forward-thinking, diverse, inclusive, and prosperous region. At its core, the Economy League's mission is to engage and inform cross-sector leaders, to work together to advance shared solutions to our region's challenges. GPLEX is our scouting mission, a chance to identify and elevate people and organizations that are doing the hard work, on the innovative edges, of building a truly greater Philadelphia.

At its best, the Economy League is a way-finding and meaning-making organization—we exist to connect leaders like you with new ideas and practices in a variety of fields. And this year is no exception. In addition to the amazing cohort we have carefully assembled with the help of our tireless Recruitment & Selection Committee, we will be taking our theme of "sparking innovation, creating connections" quite seriously.

We will explore strategies for neighborhood stabilization underway in North Philadelphia; how the focus on social determinants of health is changing the ways that health care institutions and community organizations are serving individuals and families; how immigrant entrepreneurs are reinventing South Philadelphia neighborhoods; how and for whom collaboration between government, philanthropy, the private sector and community is creating quality public spaces; how cities like Philadelphia are working with partners to create innovative solutions to waste management and renewable energy; and whether and how the region is poised to become "Cellicon Valley," home to a dynamic biotech cluster with enormous growth potential.

GPLEX veterans will notice a new feature in 2019: instead of a mere report back on Regional Explorations on Friday morning, we will do "deep dive" topical conversations. We hope this will add to the experience.

Since last year's Seattle GPLEX, the Economy League has launched several new initiatives. In January and February we ran the Full City Challenge, a very successful social impact accelerator focused on food and the first iteration of GPLEX Labs. In addition to the great projects that were surfaced—you will meet the winners of the Full City Challenge during GPLEX 2019—we were thrilled that so many GPLEX alums contributed time as mentors, advisors, and judges.

We also held two interesting programs under the "GPLEX 365" banner in partnership with Venture Café at the University City Science Center: in November, we gathered an esteemed panel to discuss the potential impact of the collaborative framework developed during the unsuccessful Amazon HQ2 bid, and in May we partnered with Education Testing Services and the Graduate! Network to dig into the challenges of building skills and competencies for a competitive 21st century workforce. Stay tuned in 2019–20 for other opportunities to connect with your fellow GPLEXers.

I am honored that you have chosen to spend a couple of days GPLEXing with the Economy League. I look forward to exploring with you!

Greening our Region: Renewables & Recycling

The explosion at Philadelphia Energy Solutions' South Philadelphia refinery in June and its probable closure has brought the relationship between economic growth and environmental issues into public focus. But in the face of a changing climate, local leaders across sectors have long been engaged in the complex work

of transitioning the region to a greener future. This exploration will examine the challenges and opportunities that come with renewable energy and materials recovery, and what they mean for the livelihood and well-being of people and businesses across the region.

IMMIGRANT BUSINESSES & COMMUNITIES

The Fabric of the City: **Immigrant Communities**

Much of Philadelphia's recent growth has been powered by a significant influx of immigrants. These newcomers accounted for 13% of the city's population in 2017, and together earned nearly \$27 billion in 2017—an almost \$3B increase from 2016. With debate about immigration central to the current national political climate, we want to dive deep into the contributions of immigrants, particularly entrepreneurs, to the Greater Philadelphia region. This exploration will focus on unique immigrant-driven ventures and crosssector collaborations that are helping to support and enrich local communities.





NEIGHBORHOODS / PRESENTED BY PNC BANK

Neighborhood Stabilization: Investment & Redevelopment in North Philadelphia

For the past 15+ years, Philadelphia has seen robust growth in a subset of neighborhoods that some have come to call "Greater Center City." These neighborhoods are now stable and growing, attracting higher-income and well-educated new residents and quality urban amenities. However, Philadelphia's growth has been incredibly uneven, with neighborhoods in North, Lower Northeast and Southwest Philadelphia continuing to shrink and decline. In neighborhoods that had historically suffered from redlining, concentrated poverty, low labor-force participation, blight, and declining real estate property values are the rule.

Civic and business leaders are increasingly aware of these dynamics and there is a growing movement toward equitable development that aims to extend inclusive growth into neighborhoods where it has not yet penetrated organically. This exploration will examine projects and initiatives underway in North Philadelphia focused on driving equitable growth without displacement.





PUBLIC SPACES / PRESENTED BY KNIGHT FOUNDATION AND PENNONI

Equitable Rebuilding and Repurposing of Public Spaces

The national spotlight is on Philadelphia when it comes to the reimagining and repurposing of our public spaces, especially through the work of initiatives such as the Knight/WPF Civic Commons and the City's Rebuild. As projects like Dilworth Park, the Rail Park, the new renovations at the Free Library—Parkway Central, Spruce Street Harbor Park and the impending I-95 cap come to life, we need to continue to stay attentive and ask ourselves, "Who are these spaces for and who may be missing from them?" This exploration will examine various models for improving public space in Philadelphia today and shine a light on initiatives focused on ensuring broad access to quality public spaces.

LIFE SCIENCES / PRESENTED BY PHLCVB

Is Philadelphia Poised to become Cellicon Valley?

The \$4.8 billion acquisition of Philadelphiabased gene therapy company Spark Therapeutics by Swiss life sciences giant Roche announced in February 2019 sent a global signal about the strength of Greater Philadelphia's life sciences innovation ecosystem. With globally renowned research institutions, a world-class talent pool, and a rich innovation-based economic development network, the prospects for the region's gene therapy future look bright. This exploration will examine the extraordinary cross-sector collaboration behind Greater Philadelphia's emergence as a global hub for gene therapy, the outlook for the local life sciences cluster, and how local industry leaders are grappling with issues of access and equity during a period of intense growth.





Public Health: Ensuring Access to High-Quality Care for Vulnerable Populations in an Era of Transformation

How are bigger institutions addressing social determinants of health to change the way services are delivered at the community level? Initiatives like PHMC's new Wellness Center, CHOP's Healthier Together and Jefferson's Health Equity Initiative are using data to inform proactive intervention and doing more with community-based organizations

to address equity and remove barriers to integrated care delivery. This exploration will take a closer look at community-focused health initiatives while weighing the challenges that face our residents with the severity of the opioid epidemic and the impending closure of Hahnemann Hospital.

GREATER PHILADELPHIA BY THE NUMBERS



Population Growth in the City and the Region 2007–2018

Following the 2008 recession, the city's resident population retracted but then grew faster than the surrounding metropolitan area. By 2018, the city's population was 3.6% greater than its population count in 2007. Greater Philadelphia steadily grew through the 2008 recession and is now 3.1% larger than it was in 2007.



The **city's** population grew by **3.6%** between 2007 and 2018 to **1,584,138**.1

The **region's** population grew at a slightly slower rate, rising by **3%** to **6,096,372** in 2018.¹

The city's **foreign-born population** grew by **2.5%** between 2007 and 2017. Today, **1 in 8** Philadelphians is foreign-born.^{2,3}

The city's **Millennial population** (20-to-34-year-olds) grew by **6%** since 2007. They make up **26%** of the city's residents as of 2017.^{2,3}



The number of **city residents with a bachelor's degree or higher** increased by **6%** between 2007 and 2017. Today, **27%** of city residents have a bachelor's degree or higher.^{2,3}






The average **median value of a home** in Greater Philadelphia decreased by \$59,000 in real terms since 2007 but increased in the city by \$9,000. As of June 2019, the median value of a home in Greater Philadelphia is \$233,300 and \$155,100 in the city.4

Renter-occupied housing in Greater Philadelphia increased by **4%** since 2007. Renters occupy **one-third** of the occupied housing units in the region.^{5,2}

Employment Growth in Philadelphia 2007–2019

Following the 2008 recession, employment levels in Philadelphia's service industries rebounded and then steadily grew. The two fastest growing industries were the "Accommodation and Food Services" and the "Health Care and Social Assistance" industries (32.8% and 31.8% greater than their 2007 employment counts respectively). Conversely, the "Manufacturing" industry continued to decline following the recession (32.3% less than its 2007 employment count). The most interesting trends came from the "Mining, Logging, and Construction" and "Real Estate Rental and Leasing" industries which initially declined following the recession but have now recently surpassed their 2007 employment counts; this may reflect the recent development boom witnessed within certain areas of the city



As of June 2019, the number of reported jobs in the city and the region are 738,800 and 2,964,000 respectively.6

Between 2007 and 2019, 155,000 additional jobs were reported in the region, the city alone accounting for **76,100** jobs. Employment in the city grew faster than the region during this period, with the city's share of regional employment increasing

The percent of city residents aged 16 years

and over who were employed in full-time,

year-round jobs increased by **3.5%** between

The median household income in the city is \$40,649.00 as of 2017. This is \$25,636.00 lower than the region.2



The number of city jobs in the **Health** Care and Social Assistance Industry increased by 32% between 2007 and 2019 to account for one-fourth of the city's total job count.8



As of 2016, 15.7% of Greater Philadelphia's businesses are minority-owned.9



The city's **unemployed** population decreased by 1.2% since 2007.5 As of May 2019, the city's unemployment rate is 4.9%.7

Note: Greater Philadelphia refers to the Philadelphia metropolitan statistical area and includes the Pennsylvania counties of Philadelphia, Bucks, Montgomery, Chester, and Delaware, the New Jersey counties of Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, and Salem, the Delaware county of New Castle, and the Maryland county of Cecil.

PLENARY SPEAKERS



Keynote

Damon Centola

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF COMMUNICATIONS, ANNENBERG SCHOOL OF COMMUNICATION. **UNIVERSITY OF** PENNSYLVANIA

DIRECTOR, NETWORK DYNAMICS GROUP

Damon Centola is a Professor in the Annenberg School for Communication and the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences at the University of Pennsylvania, where he is Director of the Network Dynamics Group. Before coming to Penn, he was an Assistant Professor at M.I.T. and a Robert Wood Johnson Fellow at Harvard University.

He is one of the world's leading experts on social networks and behavioral change. His work has been published across several disciplines in journals such as Science, Nature, Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, American Journal of Sociology, and Journal of Statistical Physics. Damon received the American Sociological Association's Award for Outstanding Article in Mathematical Sociology in 2006, 2009, and 2011, and was awarded the ASA's 2011 Goodman Prize for Outstanding Contribution to Sociological Methodology and the 2017 James Coleman Award for Outstanding Research in Rationality and Society. He was a developer of the NetLogo agent based modeling environment, and was awarded a U.S. Patent for inventing a method to promote diffusion in online networks. He is a member of the Sci Foo community and Fellow of the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University.

Popular accounts of Damon's work have appeared in The New York Times, The Washington Post, The Wall Street Journal, Wired, TIME, The Atlantic, Scientific American, and CNN. His speaking and consulting clients include Amazon, Microsoft, Apple, Cigna, the Smithsonian Institution, the American Heart Association, the National Academies, the U.S. Army, and the NBA.

Damon's research has been funded by the National Science Foundation, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, the James S. McDonnell Foundation, and the Hewlett Foundation. He is a series editor for Princeton University Press, and the author of How Behavior Spreads.



Brandon J. Flood

SECRETARY OF THE BOARD OF PARDONS, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA Prior to his appointment as Secretary of the Pennsylvania Board of Pardons, Brandon J. Flood spent nearly a decade working for the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, where he served in a multitude of professional capacities, that of which include the positions of legislative assistant, senior research analyst for the House Democratic Caucus' Legislative Policy & Research Office (LPRO) and executive director of the Pennsylvania Legislative Black Caucus. In the aforementioned roles, Brandon's area of expertise included research and analysis, bill drafting, public relations and mass communications, organizational administration and legislative advocacy, and stakeholder engagement.

Following his tenure with the House of Representatives, Brandon went on to serve as legislative director for the Service Employees International Union (SEIU-PA) State Council, which currently holds the distinction of being Pennsylvania's second largest public sector union. In this role, Brandon was charged with both developing and advancing SEIU-PA's legislative agenda, tracking relevant legislation, coordinating endorsement interviews, serving as a liaison to the Pennsylvania General Assembly and the Office of the Governor, and drafting formal position correspondences on behalf of the organization. Immediately preceding his appointment as Secretary, Brandon served as policy & reporting specialist for the Pennsylvania Department of General Services' Bureau of Diversity, Inclusion and Small Business Opportunities (BDISBO). In this role, Brandon was tasked with developing both internal and external policy for the Bureau, serving as a liaison to the Pennsylvania General Assembly and the Office of the Governor, assisting with the generation of both annual and statutorily mandated agency reports, and overseeing the Bureau's various social media and marketing platforms.

Several of his widely recognized professional accomplishments include but are not limited to instituting a full-time Equal Opportunity Officer and attendant Equal Opportunity Advisory Committee for the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, successfully advancing legislation urging the City of Harrisburg, the House Democratic Caucus and the Wolf administration to institute a "ban the box" policy relating to employment opportunities under their respective jurisdictions, and partnering with the Public Interest Law Center of Philadelphia (PILCOP) in an effort to target Pennsylvania employers that unfairly discriminate against applicants possessing criminal histories. In addition, from 2015 through February of 2019, Brandon served as Chairman of the Pennsylvania NAACP's Political Action Committee and in 2016 was appointed by the National NAACP to serve as its Civic Engagement Coordinator for Pennsylvania, where he played a contributory role in registering over 1 million new voters across the commonwealth.

Brandon currently resides in Steelton, Pennsylvania, where he also serves as chairman of the Greater Harrisburg NAACP's Legal Redress Committee and is a sitting member of the Steelton Borough Zoning Hearing Board.





Harold T. **Epps**

DIRECTOR OF COMMERCE, CITY OF PHILADELPHIA Harold T. Epps is the Director of Commerce at the City of Philadelphia and is a business leader with over 30 years of corporate experience in providing high performance products and solutions for complex and compliance driven industries. As Director of Commerce, Harold oversees and implements policies to help both small businesses and major corporations in Philadelphia thrive. Commerce coordinates activities along neighborhood commercial corridors with small businesses and entrepreneurs, major real estate development projects, largescale business attraction and retention efforts, as well as efforts to increase minority-owned business contracting opportunities.

Formerly, Harold was the Vice-Chairman of the Board of PRWT Services and served as PRWT's President and CEO from 2007–2014. PRWT Services is one of America's largest minorityowned firms and a provider of high-performance business solutions, facilities management and infrastructure support services. Prior executive roles include Quadrant, Menasha Corporation, and Polaroid, where Harold led middle-market subsidiaries and divisions. Throughout his career, Harold built a solid reputation for positioning organizations for sustained growth, successfully managing change and restructuring, improving efficiency, spurring innovation, and maintaining a focus and discipline of continuous process and performance improvement.

Epps' personal commitment to workforce development and business opportunity diversity and inclusion efforts continue to drive his civic and board activities. Harold is Co-Chairman of the Comcast National African-American Advisory Council, and a member of Philadelphia International Airport Advisory Board, Philadelphia Industrial Development Corporation (PIDC), Select Greater Philadelphia, Global Philadelphia Association, Cobbs Creek Restoration and Community Foundation Board, PHLCVB and Community College of Philadelphia boards. Formerly, Harold served as the chairman of the African-American Museum of Philadelphia, and an executive committee member of the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce and The Urban League of Philadelphia. He was recently honored with the title of Trustee Emeritus at his alma matter, North Carolina Central University.



J. Jondhi Harrell

DIRECTOR, THE CENTER FOR RETURNING CITIZENS J. Jondhi Harrell is the Founder and Executive Director of The Center for Returning Citizens (TCRC) in Philadelphia. TCRC offers comprehensive services for prisoners and formerly incarcerated people in the areas of re-entry, pre-entry, and advocacy. He plays a leadership role in numerous organizations, including the National Committee of Alternatives to Violence Re-Entry Program, the Formerly Incarcerated and Families Working Group of Decarcerate PA, the Coalition against Mass Incarceration (CAMI Philly), the Re-Entry Coalition of Philadelphia and the Quaker Network to End Mass Incarceration. Jondhi is co-founder of the Transitional Services Coalition and the BLOC Party (Build Lobby Organize Campaign), the movement to forge returning citizens of Philadelphia and Pennsylvania into a cultural, social, political, and economic coalition. He is a frequent guest lecturer on the topics of Mass Incarceration, Social Injustice, The New Underground Railroad, and Re-building Black America at universities, colleges, churches, organizations, and community events. Jondhi has a bachelor's degree in human service management from the University of Phoenix and is a master's in social work candidate at Temple University.
